

структури на двата метода, наред със сравнително ниския процент обяснена дисперсия, свидетелстват за проблеми в разбирането на твърденията, които могат да се дължат както на неясно формулирани айтеми, така и на културни специфики. Планира се нова експертна оценка на айтемите и по двата въпросника. Получената сравнително близка до оригиналната факторна структура, както и константираните все пак високи стойности на коефициентите за надеждност, ни дават основание за продължаване на работата по адаптацията на въпросниците за его състоянията и житейските позиции.
